 will in which I thank God for, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human
 life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased
 God to bless me with, I Give and bequeath to my wife Ruth Young
 one third part of the Land I now live on or and during the term of
 her natural life, and four head of Horses and the Household furniture
 and an equal divide of the stock of the Stock 2. I give to my son Robert
 Young one Cow. 3. I give to my son Joseph Young the half of the
 Wagon, the other half to my wife to be equally divided between them
 and one bed and an equal divide of the all the rest of the Stock 4. I
 give to my son Ezekiel Young one bed and an equal divide of the Stock
 5 I give to my son William Young one Hundred and fifty acres of
 Land lying on the waters of Fox Creek one bed and an equal divide of
 the Stock to him his heirs, Executors Administrators or assigns forever 6. I
 give to my son Thomas Young the Tract of Land I now live on and
 garden lot, and one bed, and an equal divide of the Stock to him his heirs or
 Executors & Administrators. I do hereby revoke all former Wills by me made hereafter
 In Wit I have hereunto set and brad my seal this 12th of April 1800—

Grayson May Court 1800. This Nuncupative Will of Ezekiel Young was
 proven in Court, by Joseph Fields, who deposed that the same was made on the
 time of the last sickness of the said Ezekiel at his habitation and that the
 said Ezekiel called upon him and Benjamin Phelps that such was his Will

The Last Will of James Worell, I James Worell a Citizen of the State of Virginia and County of Grayson do make Ordain and declare this to be my last Will and Testament. Item To my beloved Wife Barbara Worell I bequeath One Brown mare which was her property and the principal of all the other property she possessed when her and me was married of which five Cows is the greater part which Cows is to be sold and the money kept by my Executors for her use as she stands in need thereof and her money she had before mentioned she is to have as she stands in need of it. Her Land she is to have to do as she thinks proper with likewise my son Esau to keep Twenty Dollars of my Estate in his hands if she should come to want to let her have it as she needs it and if she never stands in need thereof then it to be disposed of as the rest of my Estate. Item All my Real and personal Estate is to be sold at Publick sale to the highest bidder and after my Just Debts are paid the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my seven Children except Twenty Dollars that I do leave to my step son John Pernick. And lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved son Esau Worell and Trusty friend John Green to be Executors of this Will and Testament this seventh day of the first month Anno domini one thousand eight hundred and two.
