 Will and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 that is to say: first I give and advise to my son Elijah and his heirs forever
 a certain part of my land containing the plantation on which I now live situated
 lying and being in the aforesaid County of Patrick on the East side of the
 mountain near the Elk spur and bounded with lines as follows: to wit
 Beginning on a pine tree on the West side of said Survey thence a conditional
 line starting nearly north from the fourfoot beechy and so with the Original
 line called for in the Patent to the beginning pine tree in the West ~~Corner~~
 supposed to contain One hundred Acres be the same more or less. I do also
 give and advise to my son Elisha and his heirs forever One other part of
 my land known by the name of Miller Shockley's place and being part
 of a survey of three hundred and thirty five Acres laid off by a conditional
 line down Beginning on a corner pine tree in the East line of said Survey
 thence a straight line running rather Northwest to a chestnut tree on the
 North side of a small creek near to William Edwards, at a place
 known by the name of the Flaxpond thence up said Creek to a measured
 to a chestnut Oak tree on the North side of said creek in the Original line
 round said Survey thence with the original line round said Survey as called
 for in the patent to a corner maple tree thence still on with the Original
 line to the beginning Pine tree supposed to contain One hundred Acres be
 the same more or less. And lastly as to all the rest residue and Remainder
 of my estate Lands and Tenements goods and chattels of what kind or
 nature soever I leave the same to be sold at twelve months Credit and
 the money arising from such sale after paying all my just debts to be

make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament: That is to say
principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul unto the
hand of the Mighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the Mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate
wherein it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give advise
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First I give
and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Mary One third of my plantation
and two cows together with One bed and all the Kitchen furniture during her
life. Secondly I give unto My dear daughter my beloved daughter One hundred
and fifty Dollars. I also give to Daughter Elizabeth One hundred and
fifty Dollars which to be raised by the sale of my perishable property, and
if it is not sufficient they are to wait like their mother's access for the
balance, and if anything remain my advise it is to be equally divided
