In the name of God amen. - I James Phillips of Grayson County and State of Virginia, being Weak in body but of sound mind and disposing Will, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. To Wit, First I bequeath my soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it. Secondly I give to my dear and loving Wife Peggy the dwelling house wherein I now live with all the furniture thereunto belonging and all the stock together with all the lands and improvements thereunto about it, for and during her natural life or widowhood, and that she have power at her discretion to contribute any part of my estate to see any of my children as she shall think proper and after her decease or intermarriage, I do give and direct all my Estate both Real and personal Estate to be equally divided amongst my children to wit, Luchiey, Polly, John, James & Thomas. Lastly I do constitute and appoint my loving wife Peggy Phillips Executrix and Sole Executor of this my last Will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of May 1814.
