On the names of John Starr & June 28th day 1830.
 I John Starr of Grayson County and State of Virginia being far advanced
 in age and being lame in body and knowing in the consequence of my
 departure cannot be far distant, think proper, which I am of sound mind
 and disposing memory to make this my last Will and Testament in the manner
 and following To wit: and first it is my will and desire that my son
 Jeremiah shall have the part of Lewis conveyed to him and use in his lawful
 person except the Cunningham ship which he is to give up when ever he moves his
 tanning stand this place, the land and forest of the appearance of the same
 belonging to be his & his heirs forever. And 2^d It is my will and desire
 that my son Lewis shall have the balance of land, the tract where on he
 now lives together with the property of every description, namely all the houses
 lots & kitchen furniture plantation utensils all the stock of horses cattle hogs
 sheep &c after my death to be his & his heirs forever, but shall be bound to support
 take care of and through life & defray my funeral charges & furthermore in
 compensation of the land & property bequeathed to him I command him to give
 and it is my will and desire that he (Lewis) shall pay unto my daughter Sally
 Hytton the value of two hundred dollars in good property at any time she may
 and he can spare or any part thereof, and after my death, before said of the land
 she can take place the balance of any to be paid in money &c it is my will and
 desire that my daughter Sally Hytton shall have a painted & antique Chest &c
 and she shall appoint Committee to obtain my son Jeremiah's share my
 lawful Executor to this my last Will & Testament. The writings colored I have
 herewith set my hand & affixed my seal the day and date above written.
