In the name of god Amos; I John Lewis Jr of the County Grayson and State of Virginia being very weak in body but of perfect mind minding the will be given unto god, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of all mighty god that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith God hath pleased god to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and fashion, I first I make I appoint Spencer Bond & Samuel Lee to be my executors & Executors of this my last will and Testament; all my just debts to be paid in the first place and my Estate to be divided as followeth, To my son Spencer Bond I give and bequeath two hundred & fifteen acres of land known by the mill on Bens Creek joining John Robinsons land, in three tracts of land all joining to my son Hugh Bond I give and bequeath this tract of land where I now live and one other tract, joining the two tracts, contains two hundred acres, one hundred acres also to my wife Charity, I give and bequeath all the property that I have as long as she lives single for to raise and support my children and the land that I left to my poor Hugh Bond as long as she lives a widow, and if she marries then for her to have an equal share with my four daughters in the property and that to be sold by my executors & Executors equally divided amongst them, and I would not no sale of no property I have except my wife Charity marries again and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke disannul all and every other former Testament will devise bequest & Executors by me in any wise before named, written and bequeathed satisfying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three signed sealed and delivered by the said John Lewis Jr his last will and Testament, in the presence of John Lewis Sr who in his presence and in the presence of each of these have hereunto subscribed my name.

I Philip Beamer of Grayson County Virginia being weak in Body but of perfect mind I sincerely thank be to god for the same & calling to mind Well that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and testament that is to say first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty god that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion my Executors (as touching) such worldly Estate when with it both please god to be pious with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner & form. First I will that all my just debts be paid, also I will that Rhoady Beamer my beloved wife do have the plantation with the appurtenances along thereunto that I now live on for her support her life time also my stock of horses cattle & hogs & sheep & with my waggon & farming tools house hold kitchen furniture, and at her death all the personal Estate if any to be equally divided among all my children, VIZ I will my Daughters Charaes Beamer & Nancy Beamer & Nancy Beamer now if each or either do marry have as the other Daughters VIZ One Six & Ten Cents & furniture each & two sheep each - also that my house hold of land be for my youngest son Propack Beamer at the death of my wife Rhoady and if he comes of age to be his own agent before his mother's Death that he have privilege to work on any part of said tract of land so as not to be any detourment to her support in her life time. I also will all my other lands to be equally divided between my other four sons to witz Peter Beamer Henry Beamer Isaac Beamer & Richard Beamer so that those that have made improvements obtain their improvements they have made. I do by this present codicil ratify & confirm my said last will and testament and do further give & bequeath unto my loving grandson Philip Edwards an Equal share since with all my own children in all my personal estate at the death of my wife Rhoady I also constitute ordain my son Peter Beamer the sole Executor of this my last will and testament.
