First I will (that ^{to} my Just Debt be paid) I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken to be buried in a decent manner and my soul to God that gave it. Then I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Constance Wells all my moveable Estate to be her Right and property. Then I give my son Jacob Wells all the land whereon I now live to be his Right and property and my beloved wife Constance Wells to have the use of it during her natural life. And then she shall have tract of land whereon my son William Wells and live. I give unto my beloved wife Constance Wells and for her to give all the six of my children William Wells, Anthony Wells, Nancy Cary John Wells Mary Wells Bryan James Wells three pounds a piece. I also appoint my wife and Charles Cunningham Executors of this my last will and testament. Made at Kingston September tenth day 1809.
