acres more or less Thirdly I give and devise unto my grand
son Robert Montgomery son of William the aforesaid premises and
parcel of land provided that he be the first of his name to be

her household furniture and live stock that I have given her as here-
after named for her support for and during her natural life &c.
then to be freely enjoyed by him the said Robert Montgomery and his

line Beginning at a tree by a branch corner to the land that I have

containing one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less

to be freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever Seventhly my will
is that my Daughter Martha Montgomery have no more of my land
and other property than I have already given her &c. Eighthly
I constitute and appoint my two son in laws Robert and William
