In the Name of God Amen I William G Linton of the County of Grayson Being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank god and calling to mind the uncertainty of Human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased god to bless me with I give and Bequeath the same in the manner following that is to say The money now a summing from the United States & from a Suit at Law now depending in Gray County North Carolina I wish all my Funeral Expenses and last debts be paid out of it and the balance of any to remain in the hands of my wife Mary Ann Linton for to furnish a dwelling house now or hereaftre there be any remaining for to go to the use of the family First I leave to my beloved wife Mary Ann Linton the whole of the land whereon I now live during her natural life or widowhood and shall she intermarry with any person or at her decease in either case the land to be equally divided amongst my three Daughters Mary Margaret Hayes & Ann Lintons or part to sale if she should choose and the money arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided amongst them and I bequeath to my son John Linton three Dollars to be paid out of my Estate and the household furniture the first the now claimed by my three Daughters to remain in their possession and the other to remain with my wife And all debt or any other property which I shall or may hereafter become due to me in any wise to go to the use of wife Mary Ann Linton All the rest of my Estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever it may be not herein mentioned particularly I desire may be equally divided betwixt my wife and three Daughters herein before mentioned which I give to them and their heirs forever And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Mary Ann Linton and my daughter Mary Linton Executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this Thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred twenty seven Signed before me & delivered by William G Linton as and for his last will and testament in the presence of
