I first Will that all my Just Debts be paid. Also that my clothing be divided between my brother John Gittens and my nephew John Finell as they would tel each or either of them. my brother John to have my big Bible and my nephew to have the smaller one. And all the rest of my books to be equally

divided between them both. John Gittens's wife to have my Hat and one stamped Bedcover and spun cotton to make one more. And the said Finell to have two stamped Bedcovers. And also I do Will all my land unto my nephew John Finell. and I do Will all my movable property unto my youngest brother John Gittens and my nephew John Finell with all my Bonds and Debts to be equally divided between them both. And also constitute and appoint William Williams Esq^r and Libni Coffin jun my trusty friends Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentyfirst day of March one thousand eight hundred and two
