In obedience to an order to us directed from the Honorable Court of Grayson dated the 26th day of December 1831. We have proceeded to examine the accounts of Edward Jones administrator of the estate of Matthew M. Dillard deceased. And we find the estate amounted to two hundred & seventy four dollars & seventy three cents. And the said Edward Jones having produced vouchers for the sum of two hundred & twenty five dollars & twenty four cents, which leaves a balance in his hands of Nineteen Dollars & forty nine cents. signed by

constitute this my last will and testament in form and
manner following Viz
I term first I give and devise unto my beloved wife Rebecca
Lundy My Plantation house and premises wherein I now live
for and during her natural life or widowhood to be laid off in
the following manner beginning at a white oak sapling corner
to Amos Lundy's survey then south 44 West with said survey
Poles to two Red oaks North 27 West 66 Poles to the old Little
River Road and with the several courses thereof till it intersects
the old patent line and with the same to the Beginning contain
ing sixty acres by estimation be the same more or less and
after my beloved wife Deceased or sound marriage I give
and devise the aforesaid Land and Premises unto my
Daughter Rachael Lundy to be freely enjoyed by her
and her heirs forever. I term second I give and devise
unto my son Amos Lundy all the remainder parts of the aforesaid
tract of land Lying on the south west side of Little River old road
to be freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever. Thirdly I give
and devise unto my seven children hereafter named Viz Ruth
Lundy Sharon Lundy James Lundy Anna Lundy Lewis Lundy
Ethan Lundy and Amos Lundy each of them on dollar to be paid in common
Trade out of my estate by my executors hereafter named. Fourthly my
will is that all my just debts be paid out of my estate by
my executors hereafter named. Fifthly I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Rachael old year old mare sold to be freely enjoyed
by her and her heirs forever. Sixthly I give and bequeath
unto my beloved wife Rebecca Lundy all the Residue of my personal
Property of every species whatsoever to be freely enjoyed by herself
for and during her natural life or widowhood and to be disposed
after her decease as she may think proper. Seventh my will
is that my wife is that thereby appoint constitute and name
ate my friends William Bartlett and my friend Ezra Stuckler
to be my Executors of my Last will and testament truly
Reckoning and Quannulling and declaring void all former will
and testaments heretofore by me made and declared hereby acknowl
edging this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal.
