 the decease of their mother only if Nathan should get married ^{before} his mother's
 decease he may have his part. I likewise constitute make and Ordain the
 sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament all and singular my
 lands meynages and tenements by her and them freely to be possessed and
 enjoyed and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and annul all and every
 other former Testaments Wills legacies bequests and Executors by me in any way
 before named, Written and bequeathed ratifying and Confirming this and no

Your Commissioner finds that nothing more than the above bond on Thomas Allcott & Henry Higgin came to the hands of the Committee - eighty dollars of which was paid to Mr Allcott on the 13th day of October 1833 for keeping & clothing the said Eli Allcott, Byron - Your Commissioner then in the attendance made before the Court for his humble fee bills, but was induced to enter & at \$3.00 at his own request. Whether the attendance to Mr Allcott for feeding, clothing & taking care of the said Eli is too much or to little your Commissioner does not undertake to determine, but he is informed that two respectable freeholders of the County thought proper to allow him \$10. per year. From the statement now made and there with exhibited your Commissioner finds that only the sum of \$133.76 now remain of Eli Allcott's distributed fund of his father's personal estate, which is not sufficient to pay the amount now due to Mr Allcott for keeping the said Eli by about the sum of \$26.28. Your Commissioner also happened to say that the whole of the above balance of \$133.76 has been paid over by Mr Nuckolls to Mr Allcott so that nothing now remains in his or one of Eli Committee.

Grayson County — That in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty seven and this twenty day of November I Stephen Clark of the state and county above mentioned have through the mercy of God and his kind providence has preserved me to the present date in a sound mind though weak in body but thanks be to his name for his peculiar aid that has kept my memory in full vigor so that I am able to make and set the shewing of him in reflecting on a future day and therefore I have this day above named resolved to make my last Will and testament and not to be revoked by the displeasure of my loving wife Sally Clark now living nor by the suffer of her body which are my heirs that neither of them shall have the power to revoke this my last Will and testament but that it shall remain at my option during my natural life and that after my decease if there should be found any contradiction in this my last Will and testament I shall not be considered that the first shall be father of this my last Will and the latter part of the said Will to be rejected but that the last shall be taken as the first and the first as the latter as in any other part or parts of this my last Will and testament — and therefore I Stephen Clark do bequeath and give to my oldest son John H. Clark thirty dollars and so to my son oldest son Jeffery Clark I give and bequeath in this my last will the sum of thirty dollars and this is the amount that each of them of the two sons shall have and no more paid that my son Jeffery the son to the oldest shall be paid by the third oldest son of mine Andrew J. Clark the amount of thirty dollars and his my first named son John H. Clark shall be paid by my youngest son named Silvester Clark the amount of thirty dollars and no more and as the land on which I am now living which I have bought and paid for the same I have in possession in fee simple or forever to me and my heirs and assigns but as the lines are open and unsurveyed I cannot tell the number of acres and that in case I should decease before the said land is surveyed each of my two youngest sons shall have an equal part to get the line closed the expense of which shall be born in an equal share for if it was surveyed it should be my will that the two youngest sons named the first named John H. Clark & the second Silvester Clark each should have an equal share or part of the said land on which I now live but as it is unsurveyed that the foregoing failure of the word surveying is not intended as a condition but as the fulfillment of my last Will and testament so that if it is surveyed or not it shall be taking by the meaning of my will viz. that I Stephen Clark do give and bequeath to my two youngest son the first named Andrew Clark and the second named Silvester Clark and that the land by the tract which I bought of Daniel Fisher together with the tract which I bought of Dickerson
