

In the name of God amen I Peter Coleman senior of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia being very weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling to mind the mutability of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make and Orain this my last Will and Testament that is to say. First I give and recommend my soul into the hands of All Mighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors And as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, devise and dispose of in the manner and form following. First I give and bequeath unto my Wife Abigail all my land and my Mills to be by her enjoyed while she remains my Widow and after her marriage or decease. It is my Will that the same be freely and fairly enjoyed by my son Stephen Coleman. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son William Coleman Five pounds which he is owing me by note of hand. Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my sons Abraham Coleman, Peter Coleman, Richard Coleman, Daniel Coleman each of them twentyfive cents to be paid unto them immediately after my decease. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Williams 25 cents to be paid as before. Fifthly I give unto my Daughter Rachel Burcham the sum of ten Dollars to be paid to her immediately after my decease by my executors. Sixthly I give unto my daughter Sarah Wells twentyfive cents to be paid to her as before. Seventhly as to my daughter Charity it is my desire that all my Movable property after the above named legacies is paid up be put into the hands of my executors for her maintenance and if there should be any of said property left after her decease it is my desire that it be equally divided between my sons Abraham Coleman and Stephen and my daughters Rachel and Sarah. And I do hereby Orain and Appoint my sons Abraham and Stephen to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby make Null and void all former Wills and bequests ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I

This twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six I do make this my last Will and testament, being weak in body but sound in memory. First I recommend my body to the dust and my spirit to God that gave it. And for the disposing of my worldly possessions first I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Hannah Hanson One Dollar out of my estate And to my daughter Frankie at her coming of age I give twenty pounds in a featherbed and furniture and cow and calf and other property to Valuation, and further I give and bequeath to my other two daughters Nancy and Rachel each of them a fettle bed and furniture and cow and calf and other property to Valuation to make them twenty pounds each. Further to my sons namely John, Joseph & John I give and bequeath at their coming of age to each of them a horse to be valued at twenty pounds or to be made up to that by Valuation out of my estate Further I do leave unto my loving wife Peggy Phillips all
