 this my last will and testament in the manner and form following
 that is to say, first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
 Cooly all my goods and chattels of what kind and nature soever,
 together with all my houses and lands to hold and fully enjoy
 the same during her life or widowhood; at her death or marriage
 I give and bequeath unto my four sons Andrew Harrison Jeffery
 & Benjamin all my houses and lands to be equally divided
 amongst them, and at the death or marriage of my above named
 wife I do further give and bequeath unto my three eldest daughters
 Elizabeth Ruth and Elizabeth to each One Dollar, and at the death
 or marriage of my wife I do further give and bequeath unto my

above named four sons and two youngest daughters Rachel & Susan all
 the remaining house hold furniture and property of what kind and
 nature soever to be equally divided amongst them all. I do hereby publish
 this my last will & testament revoking all former wills by me made.
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty sixth day
 of November 1829. Signed sealed published and declared by the above named
 Peter Cooly to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at
 his request and at his presence have hereunto subscribed our names as
 witnesses to the same.
