 with one hundred acres of Land round about it together with the  
 house and house hold furniture one black mare and one Cow

17 I her chosen to be freely possessed by her during her natural life or widowhood  
Then after her decease or second marriage I give and devise the aforesaid  
Lundy said land and premises unto my youngest son Azariah Lundy to be  
Will freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever. Thirdly I give and bequeath  
unto my three other sons (viz) Daniel Lundy Isaac Lundy  
and Richard Lundy hirs that debt due to me from James Reese  
and a debt from Josiah Decker and Daniel Lundy his to collect  
both and give Isaac and Richard Lundy hirs what is right  
thereof and both equal of her paying himself for his trouble and  
that is all I allow those three sons to have out of my Estate &c.  
Fourthly I give and devise unto my Daughter Rodea Beamer all  
that part of my land that lies east of the yachin Branch supposed  
to be a hundred acres more or less to be freely enjoyed by her and  
her heirs forever. Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my  
Daughter Mary Harrold ten Dollars in cash or good property, and  
to my daughter Elizabeth Davis I bequeath the same sum in  
like manner &c. Sixthly I give and devise unto my son Daniel  
Lundy all my land lying on the South side of his Spring Branch  
on the waters of Chesnut Creek to be freely enjoyed by him his heirs  
&c forever. Seventhly I give and devise unto my Daughter Sally  
Davis all the land and premises that she now lives on agreeable

her heirs forever as also a feather bed and furniture.

Whereas I John Renny of Grayson County and State of Virginia, do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form following, viz; I give unto my son William Renny all that Tract of Land that he now lives on, Beginning at Parkers Line, thence down the Creek to a pine tree, from thence down the Creek round the improvements to the out side line and all the Remaining part of my Land is to be divided between my four Daughters in the manner following, viz; I give unto Elizabeth all the bottom Land the East side of Crooked Creek joining the said Creek with a sufficient Quantity of timber on the whole Tract above mentioned, and if I should so happen that Elizabeth should decease & have no heir it is my Will that John Renny Son of William Renny should be heirs all the part of the aforesaid Land also I give unto my Daughter Margaret all the bottom Land lying the West side of the said Creek unto Clara's Branch and Crooked Creek is the line between each part also after my Wifes Decease I give unto my aforesaid two Daughters my house and furniture to be equally divided between them, and likewise all my Stock to be divided in like manner, excepting one cow which I give to my grand Daughter Eleanor Smith also I give unto my above named two Daughters all my farming utensils to be equally divided between them also I give unto the above mentioned, John Renny my best wearing apparel, and the ballance to them that is ready, also the other two Lots I give to my other two Daughters Jane Ballard and Eleanor Dick to Dispose of at their pleasure, also my Will is to be free to all the Heirs living on the above mentioned Tract of Land, and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Eleanor Renny and William Renny Executors to this my last will and Testament this 23<sup>d</sup> day of April 1821
