This twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight I Phillips Hannah and son do make this my last Will and testament, being well in body but sound in memory, First I recommend my body to the dust and my spirit to God that gave it. And for the disposing of my worldly possessions first I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Hannah Hanson One Dollar out of my estate and to my daughter Franky at her coming of age I give twenty pounds in a featherbed and furniture and cow and calf and other property to Valuation, and further I give and bequeath to my other two daughters Nancy and Rachel each of them a feather bed and furniture and cow and calf and other property to Valuation to make them twenty pounds each. Further to my sons namely John, Joseph & John I give and bequeath at their coming of age to each of them a horse to be valued at twenty pounds or to be made up to that by Valuation out of my estate Further I do leave unto my loving wife Peggy Phillips all

the rest of my Real and personal estate including my natural life on
Widowhood, And at her second Marriage or decease then to be disposed of
to my children and grand children hereafter named to wit: William Phillips,
Thomas Phillips, Robert Phillips, Richard Phillips, John Phillips, Joseph Phillips
and John Phillips. daughters Molly Luesenberg, Betsy Gallon, Frederick
Phillips, Lanny Cook, Nancy Phillips, and Rachel Phillips and to my
daughters Hannah: four children mainly John Hanson and William Hanson
Anne Hanson and Peggy Hanson to wit to each of them an equal part of
my estate Real and Personal, except my four grand children herefore
named to her but one child's part, And in the Willing of legacies I
mentioned not my oldest children they having received their parts.

And lastly I do constitute and Ordain my loving Wife Peggy Phillips Executor
and my loving friend Andrew Cook Executor to this my last Will and testament.

human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it
hath pleased God to bless me with. I therefore give and bequeath unto my
loving Wife Betsy the third part of all I possess during her natural life and
Widowhood and to live in the Lane till her son Joseph comes of age of
twentyone, And I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph One third part of
all my personal estate and one hundred acres of Land that I now live on
also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mildred One third part of my
personal estate after paying all Lawful Debts. And if it should please God

to call away me of these children the Other to have its part. And lastly I
do hereby constitute and appoint my loving brother Joseph Young and my
friend Jonathan Thomas Executors of this my last Will and testament hereby
revoking all other former Will or testament by me hereunto made In
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my and affixed my seal this 23rd day
of September 1808.
