Pursuant to an order of Grayson Court I have proceeded to examine the accounts between Robert Smyth administrator of the estate of Barnet Penn Deceased and the representatives of said Penn, and find from the view of the Court, that the amount of the appraisement of said estate is ninety four Dollars & ninety five cents, And that by the oath of Elizabeth Smyth formerly wife of said Barnet that Robert Smyth has her after the sale that it amounts to One hundred and between twenty one & twenty three Dollars & that Smyth was entitled to a credit of two Dollars. So I judge Robert Smyth & his securities owe to the representatives of Barnet Penn Deceased, thus Debtor, One hundred & twenty one Dollars & credit by surpluses five Dollars & by the payment of two dollars leaving a balance due to said representatives of One hundred & fifteen Dollars. Date 26th 1832.

I Samuel Shoholey of Grayson County in the State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament whereby I mean to dispose of all I do in manner and form following, that is to say, First It is my will and desire that all my funeral charges and last debt be first paid out of what money or property I may have at my decease and that all the money due to my estate be collected as soon as may be. Secondly, I give to my daughter Margaret One tract or parcel of land lying near the waters of Sandy Creek in Stokes County North Carolina. Thirdly, I give to my son John the sum of two Dollars. Fourthly, I give to my son Benjamin the sum of five Dollars. Fifthly, I give to my son Stephen the sum of five Dollars. Sixthly, I give to my daughter Elizabeth the sum of fifty cents. Seventhly & lastly I give to my son Samuel One tract or parcel of land lying on both sides of Sand Creek in Grayson County State of Virginia moreover I give to my son Samuel herein above named all my money both what is in my care and keeping or debts due to me I give it all to him together with my son his and Benjamin's with all my other clothing and house hold goods Iron & other Brass Pater Lin and glass one large Chest seven copper Chests spade and three shovels of Husbandry of what sort soever they may be I give them all to him and I do hereby revoke disannul and render void all other wills heretofore made by me and established and confirmed this present writing to be my last will and testament and I do constitute and appoint my son Samuel & all the above mentioned joint executors to this my last will & testament.
