in a low state of Health but of a sound mind and desirous therefore
that Proper to make this my last will and testament in a manner following
Myt first it is well and desire that as much of my property
belonged such as can best be spared us will pay all my just debts
and lay my Daughter Eliza a debt for her particular attention
to me and be disposed of according by Executors herein & after my death
It is my will and desire that my Beloved wife Anne should enjoy all
the least of my Estate both real and personal during her natural or
widowhood and after her death the Balance of my estate Exalt the
land be so disposed of as well makes my three youngest daughters with
the two oldest that had already received a bed and headboards and
furniture a chest and cotton wheel a piece and the Balance of any Estate
Divide amongst all my daughters Anna Martha Eliza Polly Francis
It is my Will and Desire that the land with its appurtenances
should be equally divided amongst or amongst such as my executors

Sankfort Thomas John & Richard in consequence of however of their share
not be enough payable Properly to make three youngest daughters Equal
with the two oldest the above named sons shall bear an equal part
in making them equal and lastly I do hereby constitute and
ordain my son Sankfort Hall & Peter Correll my said two executors to
this my last will and testament In witness whereof have hereunto
set my hand seal this 5 day August 1831.

Grayson September Court 1831

This last will and testament of Thomas Hall decd was
presented in Court and proved by James Dehaven & Abraham Dehaven
subscribing witnesses and ordered to be recorded And Sankfort Hall & Peter
Correll Executors herein named came into Court and entered into bond
with Thomas Baldwin & James Correll their securities in the penalty of
Two hundred Dollars with conditions as the law directs and took the
oath of Executors whereupon a certificate is granted them in due form
of law

In pursuance of an order of Court made at June term 1829 directing us
to examine into and settle the accounts of Edward Jones and Isaac Edwards executors
of George Steenfield Dods. Mr. Lewis presented on the 28th day of August 1831
at the dwelling house of James Anderson in the County of Grayson (after
being duly sworn to perform that duty) Beg leave to make the following
report. It appears that the Executors after deducting the specific legacies
mentioned in the will they were then in possession of property debts & money
contained in a list including a tract of land which has been returned
into the Clerks office and recorded according to the sum of three hundred
Dollars forty nine Dollars, property & land sold prior to the 6th day of September
1829 and the balance on the seventh of the same month there also
appears to have come in to the Executors a note on James Jones for six
Dollars, One D^o on John H. Caudle part of which was paid, the balance is
One Dollar & forty two cents a balance of a note on Aaron Miller
of One Dollar & fifty cents, also a receipt from Eli Harvey for seventy
Dollars which notes & receipts has not yet been collected, there is
several other legacies named in the will for money which has not been
settled, and the Executors having produced vouchers to the amount of
seventy nine Dollars nine & one fourth cents which taken from the above
sum of three hundred and forty nine Dollars still leaves a balance
in the hands of two hundred and forty nine Dollars nine & three fourth
cents
