This last will and testament of John Lundy Deco was proven in court

In the name of God amen
I Thomas Hall of the county of Grayson and state of Virginia being
in a low state of health but of a sound mind and disposition hereby
make known to man this my last will and testament in a manner for
following Next first it is my will and desire that as much of my property
bequeathed such as can best be spared as will pay all my just debts
and buy my Daughter Eliza a dress for her particular attention
to me and be disposed of according by Executors herein after named
2nd It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Anne should enjoy all
the best of my Estate both real and personal during her natural or
widowhood and after her death the Balance of my estate Except the
land be so disposed of as will make my three youngest daughters with
the two eldest that had already received a bequest in bequests and
furniture a chest and cotton wheel a piece and the Balance of any Equity
Divided amongst all my daughters Anna Martha Eliza Polly Frances
3rd It is my will and desire that the land with its appurtenances
should be equally divided amongst or enforced authority by my sons
Lankfort Thomas John & Charles in consequence of which of them should
not be enough purchasable property to make these youngest daughters Equal
with the two eldest the above named sons shall bear an Equal part
in making them equal and lastly I do hereby constitute and
ordain my son Lankfort Hall & Peter Monroe my sole and true Executors to
this my last will and testament. The witness thereof have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 12 day of August 1831

Grayson September Court 1831

This last will and Testament of Thomas Hall does was
presented in Court and proven by Charles Dehaven & Abraham Dehaven
subscribing witnesses and ordered to be recorded And Lankfort Hall & Peter
Monroe Executors therein, appeared came into Court, and entered into bond
with Thomas Baldwin & James Monroe their securities in the penalty of
Two hundred Dollars with obligations as the law directs and took the
oath of Executors whereupon a certificate is granted them in due form
of law

This pursuant to an order of Court made at June Term 1829 directing us
to examine the account of David Jones and Isaac Edwards Executors
of George Springfield Dece. We have perused on the 28th day of August 1829
at the dwelling house of James Anderson in the County of Grayson (after
being duly sworn to perform that duty) they came to make the following
report. It appears that the Executors after distributing the specific legacies
mentioned in the Will they were then in possession of property debts & money
contained in a list including a tract of land which has been returned
with the Clerk's office and recorded amounting to the sum of three hundred
Dollars forty nine Dollars, property & land sold part on the 6th day of Septem
ber 1829 and the balance on the seventh of the same month. There also
appears to have come in to the Executors a note on James Jones for five
Dollars One D. on John H. Cagle part of which was paid the balance is
One Dollar & forty two cents a balance of a note on Aaron Pitter
of One Dollar & fifty cents, also a receipt from Eli Harvey for seventy
Dollars which notes & receipts has not yet been collected. There is
deficient other legacies named in the will for money which has not been
settled and the Executors having produced vouchers to the amount of
seventy nine Dollars nine Dime fourth cents which taken from the above
sum of three hundred and forty nine Dollars three Dime a balance
in the hands of two hundred and sixty nine Dollars nine & three fourth
cents
