In the name of God amen I Thomas Ogles of the County of Grayson and the State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say First I give to my wife Elizabeth Ogles all the movable property of my estate for and during her natural life term of her natural life and after her decease I give the same to my children herein after mentioned equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed by them forever and secondly I give to my son John Ogles one Dollar and Thirdly I give to my son Thomas Ogles one Dollar and Fourthly I give unto my son Hercules Ogles one Dollar and Fifthly I give unto my son William Ogles one Dollar and Sixthly I give to my son James Ogles one Dollar and Seventhly I give to my Daughter Sarah Largent one Dollar and Eighthly I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Jennings one Dollar and Ninthly I give to my Daughter Hannah Robinson one Dollar which I give them their heirs executors and administrators and assigns forever and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Elizabeth Ogles and
