Agreeable to an order of Court to us directed to a pique to Elizabeth Hampton widow of Wm. Hampton deceased her Dower in the land of her deceased husband. We met on a tract of land lying on Elk Creek, for a pique, the upper part where the building stands, began at the mouth of a branch that empties into Elk Creek, running up the meanders of said branch a little above where the wagon road crosses a branch to the mouth of a small stream that comes out of the field running up said stream to a sapo grass tree thence a straight course to a white oak a shade tree in said field thence a straight course leaving two sapo grass trees on the left hand by a white oak tree marked into a road leading out of it field across a mountain and as the

read runs to the back line, then up as the line runs runs to the beginning, April the 2nd day 1831.

Pursuant to an order of Grayson Court I have proceeded to examine the accounts between Robert Smyth administrator of the estate of Barnet Penn Decceased and the representatives of said Penn, and find from the view of the Court, that the amount of the appraisement of said estate is ninety four Dollars & ninety five cents, And that by the oath of Elizabeth Smyth formerly wife of said Barnet that Robert Smyth has her after the sale that it amounts to One hundred and between twenty one & twenty three Dollars & that Smyth was entitled to a credit of two Dollars. So I judge Robert Smyth & his securities owe to the representatives of Barnet Penn Decceased, thus Debtor, One hundred & twenty one Dollars & credit by surpluses five Dollars & by the payment of two dollars leaving a balance due to said representatives of One hundred & fifteen Dollars. Date 26th 1832.
