 and testament in manner and form following viz.

I desire that all the perishable part of my Estate be immediately sold
 after my decease and out of the monies arising there from all my Just
 Debts and funeral expences be paid 2 dly after the payment of my Debts
 and funeral expences I give to my son Samuel all my lands to him and
 his heirs forever and to Samuel is to keep and support his mother during
 her natural life and he is further to give free privilege to my Daughter
 Susanna and Hannah to live here as long as they continue single if they
 choose to make this their natural home 3 dly I give and bequeath unto my
 beloved wife Elizabeth the sum of one hundred Dollars and out of the
 Money arising out of my personal property and after the Death of
 my beloved wife Samuel Boyer is to pay to his brothers and sisters
 the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars to be equally divided amongst
 them all and it is my wish and desire that the balance of the money
 arising from the sale of my perishable property and my money in hand
 be equally divided between my son John Boyer and Henry Jacob and
 Daniel Boyer and Samuel and my Daughters namely Margaret Susan-
 nah and Hannah I have give to my Daughter Elizabeth her portion
 of my Estate and it is my wish that she shall have no more I give and
 bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth her choice of beds and bed cloth-
 ing sufficient for the same I give and bequeath unto my two Daugh-
 ters Susannah and Hannah the sum of twenty two Dollars and twenty
 five Cents each and one Cow to each of them also 4 sheep each and forty
 I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends John Boyer and Jacob
 Boyer Executors of this my last will and testament hereby Revoking
 all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made in
 sh Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
 this 29th Day of June 1820.

Byron Ballard of the County of Grayson and State of Virginia, Being of sound and sound memory of mind do this day make and execute this my Last will and Testament in form and manner following (viz.)

First I give Devise unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Ballard all the house hold furniture and other things of whatsoever kind it may be that she brought to my Estate or so much thereof as is in being. Also my will is that she have my best horse, and one Cow and calf her choice of my Stock, also my will is that she have the use of my plantation on the north side of Chesnut Creek all that is within my patent lines, and free privilege of all buildings orchards and cleared lands fire wood Timber &c. and all the profits arising therefrom, for and during her Natural Life; then after her decease my will is that all my said land and that adjoining both what I bought of John Cox and John Pickersell be sold by my Executors hereafter named, and Equally divided amongst my three youngest children namely Philip Moses and Ruth Secondly I give and devise unto my son Philip Ballard all that tract Land containing one hundred and sixty Acres lying little Neck Station in Grayson County that I bought of Herman Ballard to be freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever, when he comes to age Thirdly I give and devise unto my son Moses Ballard all the Lands whereon I now live two tracts, one purchased of John Cunningham Ham, the other of Wells Ward, containing two hundred and seventy acres, to be freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever when he comes to age Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ruth Ballard one feather bed and furniture, two pots and a Dutch oven one little trunk a tea canister and a glass can, Also my will is that my four oldest children namely William and Amos Ballard Mary Chadwallader and Martha Cunningham have no more of my Estate than what I have previously given them Lastly I constitute and appoint my friends Samuel Cary Jr and Daniel Mosey my Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby declaring all former wills void &c.
