In the name of God amen I William Jones Esq. Being at the W. Jones time in a low state of health but of a sound mind do make & Will Ordain this my last Will and testament. first I give my soul to god who gave it and body to the Earth that all my my last Debts be punctly paid I Leave unto my beloved wife Let Jones the tract of Land whereon I now live during her natural life & after her decease the same land to belong to my son David Jones his heirs forever and my desire is that my son David live with his mother so long as she may live he be the longest liver and such extent of plantation as she may think right

286 This last part I submit to them only I also give unto my son George Jones the tract of land where he now lives to him & his heirs forever I also give unto my son William Jones the Land lying below Rose Creek to him and his heirs forever I also direct all my moveable Estate that is to say Stocks of all kinds to be Equally divided among all my Legatees provided all will agree in the division of said Stocks and in case not all agree that the said Stocks of all kind be sold at twelve months Credit and the monies arising from Stocks to Equally divided among all my Legatees as well all my Debts are my Estate to wit, George Jones William Jones Polly Mash David Jones Rebecca Jones and Betsey Jones these are my Legatees only I also direct my negro boy Tom to be sold at twelve months Credit & the money be Equally divided among all my Legatees as and Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Let Jones George Jones and monette Jones my Executors In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal the day & date above written in presence of Isaac Garrison Let Garrison John Mash
