I owe Stephen Reed two five hundred Dollar notes dated New York October 1821 payable in Charleston South Carolina in the course of nine months one of five hundred and as payable the year following 1822 on account of owe him about sixty Dollars which is all that I owe him you will my notes on my little memorandum book, I owe Josiah one note of three hundred and 25 dollars dated Georgia town South Carolina one note of one hundred and seventy Dollars dated Hartford; I had one gold watch of him which I was to give him one hundred and fifty Dollars the original price was one hundred and seventy; I owe James Phelps New York one hundred and seventy Dollars on account; I owe Hyde Simmons & Co on account about forty eight a fifty Dollars.
