 my money three cows with calf four ten head of great Cattle of my herd, twelve head of
 the great Cattle of my herd, three Bats, dead & I give unto my wife as much of my household
 furniture in the houses to keep & I give unto my wife my best coat and all that belong to her
 unto during her widowhood & I give unto my eldest son John Roberts the sum of One dollar
 fifty dollars and more. I give unto my son William Roberts the sum of One dollar, fifty
 and more. I give unto my son James Roberts the sum of One dollar, fifty
 I give unto my son Jonathan Roberts the sum of One dollar. I give unto my
 son David Roberts One dollar and more. I do also give unto my two sons
