children, namely, Susana M. Watson, Virginia Blaun,
Frances D. M. McMillan, William Shilton, & Mary Jane Shilton
to them and their heirs forever. The residue of my estate after
my wife's part above mentioned be taken out, to be
equally divided among my five children above
mentioned to them and their heirs forever. It is my
will and desire that my daughter Mary Jane Shilton
to have One Bed and furniture, and side board, One Codd, and
One extra off his equal portion before mentioned, to her and
her heirs forever. It is further my will, that my daughter
Mary Jane Shilton is to be boarded for from Cost as long
as she remains single, and until the death of my beloved
wife should she remain single so long I nominate and
appoint Jeremiah McMillan (my son in law) executor of
this my last will and testament, making all other wills
by me hereto made. In witness whereof I the said Thomas
Shilton, to the my last will and testament have set my
hand and Seal, declaring this to be my last will and

Saddle bridle, Cow & Calf, Two Hams, Two Pigs and my Son
