We the undersigned being called on Saturday morning February 10 1844  
into the presence of John Beazley then lying in his death bed, and being unable  
to write and supposing him to die, yet of sound mind and disposing memory  
deputed by the following to be the last Will of the said John S. Beazley  
deceased to be verbally on said morning to wit: That his wife Frances  
should take of his estate and property that pertains to which she shall be entitled  
by law, and of the remainder his full brother Robert G. Beazley should have  
two thirds, and his half brother David R. Beazley should take the remaining  
third: and furthermore that he wished his half sisters Elizabeth Juvenile, and  
Kitty Anna Juvenile to have no portion of his estate whatever.
