6th. I give and bequeath to my son Francis M^c Mullan I give my
Mantua and comprising the following (viz) the land which I
purchased of Peter Carr, that which I purchased of Jeremiah Bryan
that which I took up, and that which I purchased of Thomas Carr,
otherwise called my north tract, all of which said land form one body
at valuation I being my desire that all of my children hereof named
or those who hereafter may be named shall have equal portions of my
estate, my son John excepted whom I have given in express words
and his hereof named, and hence the reason of my having given
my land at valuation, intending that those of my children, who
may have had more than their portion of my estate given to them
in land, shall pay the surplus unto my executors which by them
is to be paid to such of my said children as have not had their
portion of my estate given them in property in order to make them
equal legacies.

7th. To the heirs of my son William M^c Mullan lawfully be-
getter of this body, I give this portion of my estate in money to be
raised out of the sales of my other property not hereof named, after
taking out One thousand Dollars to be placed in the hands of my
Executors the intent of which is required to be placed, as before
directed, at the disposal of my said wife Eady, and should said
sales not be sufficient to make said heir collect an equal leg-
ate of my estate, they are to be made equal by those who may
have had more than their portion given them in land.

8th. To my son Henry M^c Mullan I give this portion of my estate
in money to be raised out of the sales of my other property not here-
of named, also, after taking out One thousand Dollars for
the benefit of my wife Eady as before directed, and should said
sales not be sufficient to make him an equal legatee of my
estate, he likewise is to be made equal by those who may have
had more than their portion given them in land.

9th. The balance of my ^{other} land not hereof named, I direct shall
immediately after my decease, be sold at public auction in view
of the town, and the proceeds after taking out the one thousand and
dollars for the benefit of my said wife Eady as before directed, shall
be applied to making the heirs of my son William lawfully be-
getter of this body, my son Henry and any other or others of my wives
named children equal legatees of my estate.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons James
and John M^c Mullan executors of this my last intended tes-
tament, hereby revoking all other former wills, or testaments, by me
hereof made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this twenty eight day of April Eighteen
hundred and forty one.
