The Condition of the above obligation is, that if the said James M. Norford Administrator of the goods, Chattels and Credits of Joseph Gilbert die, he make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of him the said James M.
