

Know all men by these presents, that we John M. Norford, William Norford are held & firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of One hundred dollars, to be paid at wharf, mill and land to be made to the said Justices, and their successors, in kind, molasses, and such of us, our and each of our heirs, executors, administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated the fifteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred & fifty five in the 76th year of the Commonwealth.

The condition of the above obligation is, that if the said James M. Norford Administrator of the goods, chattels and credits of Joseph Gillett died, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands of Captain or Master of him the said James M. Norford or in the hands of his agents or any other person appointed by him, and the same be made an exhibit into the County Court of Goochland where he shall be tried and judged by the said Court, and such goods, chattels and credits, do call and truly administer a counting to law, and further to make a just and true account of his acting and doing therein, whereof he may be found guilty by the said Court, and all the rest of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining or for the account of the said Administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the Justice of the Peace Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively, as are entitled to the same by law, and if it shall appear to appear that any last will and testament was made by the deceased, and the same is found in Court, and the Executor or Administrators of the probate thereof, and the said James M. Norford do in each case, bring in judgment, under and deliver up his letters of Administration, then the obligation to be void, to go remain in full force.
