sons Aaron and Matthew Atkinson should have two hundred Pounds
to be equally divided between them. I desire that my son Aaron
Atkinson should have the great Bible, also Matthew Atkinson the little
Bible. Item I give unto my Daughter Nancy Atkinson twenty Pounds
in Money And the rest of my Estate my Will and desire is that it be equally
divided amongst all my Children. I nominate and appoint Jose Jordan
and Aaron Atkinson Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

And on the Motion of John Jordan one of the Executors therein named who made Oath thereto and with Joseph Turner his Security entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars with Condition as the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.
