two cows and calves and my young Grey Mare One Bed and furniture and
all my Plantation Utensils to him and his heirs for ever Item I give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Ingoda Parks my Negroe fellow Dick and one
Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Molly Parks one Negroe Girl that is due from Ephraim
Peebles to me, and one Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Juda Parks my Negroe
Woman Jane and my Chest One Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca Parks my Negroe
Girl known by the name of Fime to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Juda Parks my Negron
Woman Jane and my Chest One Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for ever
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca Parks my Negron
Girl known by the name of Time to her and her heirs for ever Item I give
and bequeath unto my two Sons Chama Parks and Aaron Parks all my
Stock of Horses cattle and Hogs to be equally divided between them two to
them and their Heirs for ever that is besides which I have given away And
my desire is that all my Household furniture that I have not given away
should be equally divided among all my children And my desire is that
my brog may be kept together to support my family And I desire that
if any of my above mentioned children should die without heir that their part of
my Estate should be equally divided among all the rest of my children to them &
their heirs for ever And I do constitute and appoint John Dawson and
Jaconias Parks my whole and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
disannulling and making void all other Wills hereto fore made by me In
Witness whereof I have unto set my hand and Seal this twenty eighth day of
August 1701.

At a Court held for Greenville County the 24 day of January 1702 This Will
was proved according to Law by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto ^{to be read} and Ordered
And in the Motion of John Dawson one of the Executors therein named who made
Oath thereto according to Law and together with Ephraim Beelles his Security
entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of two thousand
Pounds Specie conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted him
for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form Liberty being reserved for the other
Executor therein named to join in the said Probate when he shall think fit
Teste.
