

In the name of God, I Batt Peterson of Greensville County being
sick and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind, and memory do make
and ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills
heretofore by me made. First and foremost I recommend my soul to ^{Almighty} God
and my body to be decently buried by my Executors, and as to my worldly
Goods I dispose of as follows, to wit, -

Item, I give and bequeath to my son John Peterson the Plantation and tract of
Land on McHerrin whereon he now lives containing nine hundred and
eighty eight Acres, more or less, except one hundred Acres which I purchased
of James Parham which said hundred Acres lies adjoining the old tract
which I have his Bond for a title for, I also give ^{to} my said son John seven
teen and an half Acres that I bought of Robert Hicks which he is to give
a Deed for to him and his heirs and assigns forever, and also the following
Slaves (namely) Aaron, Betty, Grace, Lucy, Matt, Daffney, Hannah, Mary,
Bob, and Nathan, and their future increase, one feather bed and furniture,
which he has in possession, one bay mare called his, one foal horse called
Bomevell, six cows, and Yearlings, all the stock of hogs on said Plantation

after taking out one half of those that are fit for market next Winter, and one half of the brood of born that remains after fattening said hogs fit for market next Fall to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item,

I give and bequeath to my son Winchen Peterson all the Land that I purchased of my ^{brother} William Peterson which I have his bond for the acknowledgement for title, except twenty nine and an half Acres that I sold to Francis Hill, also all the Land that I purchased of Edward Howell except what I have sold to Francis Hill, likewise one hundred Acres purchased of James Parham adjoining the Lands given to my above said son John, and one half the tract of Land that I purchased of Jesse Jordan which I have said Jordans bond for a title to him, his heirs and assigns forever and also the following Slaves, Vir^t David, Moses, Anaca, Selou, Buldy, Hannah, Nancy, Zilpha, Frank and Sam, two horses the value of twenty pounds each, six cows, and Yearlings, twint, head of hogs, one feather and furniture to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item,

I give and bequeath to my daughter: Mason Taylor Peterson the following Slaves, Vir^t Chocolate, Manuel, Willis, Nelson, Chisum, Vinay, Tom & Moll, John, Judah, and Abram, also my bay mare, iron Chair and Harrope two feather Beds, and furniture one chest, and trunks and three hundred pounds Cash, to be raised from the bond of Matthew Mince to her and her heirs and assigns

Beds, and furniture, one chest, and trunk and three hundred pounds cash,
to be raised from the bonds Matthew May is to her and her heirs and assigns
forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Peter Peterson all my Land and Plantation,
whereon I now live, together with the Land and Plantation that I have leased
of William Burt with the Mill thereon, also all the rest of my Land that
I have any right, claim, interest, or demand in, which I have not heretofore
devised or given away to the same in what State or county it may, to him
and his heirs and assigns forever, and also the following Slaves, namely
Isaac, Hamlin, Len, Fanny, Cherry, Sepe, Stephen, Dread, Peter, and Dick
all their future increase,
and also two hundred pounds cash to be put out on Interest, also two horses
at twenty Pounds value each, six cows, and Yearlings, twenty head of hogs,
twenty barrels corn, one feather bed and furniture, to him his heirs and assigns
forever.

Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Turner one negro woman Sal to her, her heirs
and assigns forever.

Item, I leave all the rest of my Estate both real and personal after my just debts

whereon I now live, together with the Land and Plantations that I have bought
of William Burt with the Mill thereon, also all the rest of my Land that
I have any right, claim, interest, or demand in, which I have not heretofore
devised or given away be the same in what State or county it may, to him
and his heirs and assigns forever, and also the following Slaves, namely
Isaac, Hamlin, Len, Fanny, Cherry, Sep, Stephen, Dread Peter, and Dick
all their future increase
and also two hundred pounds cash to be put out on Interest, also two horses
at twenty Pounds value each, six cows, and Yearlings, twenty head of hogs,
Twenty barrels corn, one feather bed and furniture, to him his heirs and assigns
forever.

Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Turner one negro woman Sal to her, her heirs
and assigns forever.

Item, I leave all the rest of my Estate, both real and personal after my just debts
being paid to be equally divided amongst all my beforementioned children
to them, their heirs, and assigns forever.

I constitute and appoint my Son in Law Joseph Turner to be Guardian to my Son Peter Peterson untill he shall come of age.

Item,

I do hereby appoint Joseph Turner and Son John Peterson to be my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this twelfth day of January one thousand, seven hundred and Ninety five.
