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In the name of God Amen I Edward Gregg of Greensville County
make this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have written the following
that is to say: first of all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid
Then I give and bequeath to my Son Edward Gregg the Sum of Fifty Dollars
de, now in his possession with such other kind of property he may give to
him his heirs and assigns forever. Then I give and bequeath to my daughter
Susanna Eppes the Sum of Twenty Dollars to wit Sarah, Rebecca
Isaac, Doll, Rhoda, Ned, Lincy, Eliza, Patience, Eliza Charlotte
to her and her heirs and assigns forever; Then I give and bequeath to my
Son Edmund Gregg the following Negroes, Tom, Lucy and Sarah having
his heirs and assigns forever, I also give to my said Son Edmund Gregg the
Land and plantation lying in Dinwiddie County left to me by my Uncle
Edward Mitchell the other part of said Land whereon my said Uncle
Lived being left to Thomas Jones and since the Death of said Jones sold
by his Son Green Jones and myself in order to make an equal division between
Jones and myself, of which I became the purchaser, now I give the whole

Then I give and bequeath unto my said Son Edward Mitchell my first eld'st and favored Son and
he now in his possession with every other kind of property hereof in general
him his heirs and assigns forever - I then give and bequeath unto my daughter
Susanna Epper the plantation in her possession to wit Southside
Isaac, Doll, Rhoda, Violet, Lacey, Abby, Rebecca, Alfred Charlotte
to her and her heirs and assigns forever; I then give and bequeath to my
Son Edmund Gigg, the following Negroes, some land and other things
his heirs and assigns forever; I also give to my said Son Edmund Gigg the
Land and Plantation lying in Dinwiddie County left to me by my Uncle
Edward Mitchell the other part of said Land whereon my said Uncle
lived being left to Thomas Jones, and since the Death of said Jones sold
by his Son Green Jones, and myself in order to make an equal division between
Jones and myself, of which I became the purchaser, now I give the whole
of said Land and Plantation with the premises therunto belonging
provided he pay to his Mother or her Order Ten Pounds Year for Ten
years.

years, to him his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath
 to my Daughter Martha Williams three Negroes to wit Fanny,
 Selah, and Lary with ^{other} my kind of property heretofore given to her
 and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Elizabeth Adams, two Negroes, Mary & Lewis with every
 other kind of property heretofore given and now in her possession to
 her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Mary being three Negroes to wit William & his youngest
 children viz. Nigel and Tom. to her and her heirs and assigns forever.
 Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Susan Russell being
 three Negroes viz. Cipis, Jim, and Mattie, provided she arrives to
 lawful age & married to become his heirs and assigns forever.
 Item I give and bequeath to my Son, Benet Grogg when he arrives to
 the age of Twenty one years, three Negroes to wit Jim, Judy, and Peter.
 I also give to my said Son Benet Grogg the Land and plantation
 tract of Frederick Grogg with a beautiful of the tract on which I live
 to be taken by a line to be begun at the mouth of a small branch

to be taken up by a line ^{at the mouth of a small branch}
known by the name of my Pond Branch. Hence up the said Branch is
the road and thence a straight line to the corner of said Land of Mr.
Bucklow's and the Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs &
assigns forever — I have given and bequeath to my son Mitchell
Gigg, three Negroes to wit Gibson, Clarissa & Frank which bequeaths
to George of twenty one years. I also give to my said son Mitchell Gigg
all the Remainder of my Lands in the County of Greensville, after the
Death of his Mother, to him and his heirs and assigns forever —
I have given to my loving Wife Mary Gigg, all my Lands in Greensville
County, during her Natural Life with the following Negroes to wit old
Jediah, Rufford, Ephraim ~~son~~, Charles, Phil and George, and also
sic that I have given to my two Sons Burrell Gigg & Mitchell Gigg
until they arrive to the age of Twenty one years, with my Stock of every
kind, household furniture and plantation utensils and keeping and
ing and clothing my two Sons Burrell & Mitchell, and keeping that
house where I live & if I die before them I will

Death of his Mother, to him and his heirs and assigns forever —
I then Give to my loving Wife Mary Gigg, all my Lands in Greenville
County, during her Natural Life with the following Negroes to wit old
Tadpole, Rufford, Ephraim ~~son~~, Charles, Phil and Ginger, and also
say that I have given to my two Sons, Burrell Gigg & Mitchell Gigg
until they arrive to the age of Twenty one years, with my Stocks of money
Livestock, household furniture and plantation utensils she keeping and
— my and Clothing my two Sons Burrell & Mitchell, and keeping that
part of my Estate together during her Life, and lastly at the Death of
my said Wife Mary Gigg all the remainder of my Estate, of what
Nature or kind soever, or wheresoever found, I give in manner & form

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following to my Son Burrell Gigg one feather Bed and furniture and my
Medley Cote to my Son Mitchell Gigg one feather Bed and furniture and my
Dogfish Cote to my Daughter Mary Gigg one feather Bed and furniture to my daughter
Martha Williams one hundred Dollars to my Daughter Elizabeth Adams one
hundred Dollars hereby appointing my Sons Burrell Gigg, Edmund Gigg & Thomas
Williams my Executors leaving it in their power to continue the plantation in
possession until the same is paid for with the benefit of Son and Sister and the Rents
of my Estate of every kind left to be equally divided between my Children to wit
Burrell Gigg, Edmund Gigg, Burrell Gigg, Mitchell Gigg, Mary Gigg, Martha
Williams and Elizabeth Adams to them and their heirs and assigns forever and
hereby revoking all other Wills or bequest by me heretofore made declaring this to be
my only last Will and Testament this Twentieth Day of October 1807.

Greensville July Court 1878. This Will was proved according to Law by the
Oath of John Robinson and J. W. Robinson, witnesses thereto and was
so recorded. And the Executors therein named refusing to qualify as such.
On the motion of Cassell Cuggins of the said County said Will was
admitted as genuine. And for Administering Letters of Administration on the
said Testators Estate with the Will annexed in due form they having made
Oath thereto according to Law, and with J. W. Robinson, Robert Woodard
and John Oliver their Securities do acknowledged their Bond in the penalty
of fifty thousand Dollars conditioned as the Law directs.
