In the name of God Amen I Isaac Fox of the County of Greensville and State of Virginia being sick and weak of Body, but in sound mind and memory and calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing this appointed for all once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the dust to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors who I shall hereafter appoint

Nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the general resurrection
by the mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate with
which it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I give and dispose
of the same in the following manner and form, In primis I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Margaret B Fox one Negro Man by the name
of Reb. but if my daughter Margaret B Fox should die without an
Heir Lawfully begotten of her body and living at her Death my Will and
desire is that the said Negro Man Reb. be equally divided among my
Children. 1st I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally Funnell Twenty
Pounds and to my Daughter Letia Funnell one Negro by the name of Hannah
3rd I give and bequeath to my Son John Fox two Acres of Land and Twenty
Pounds more or less. 4th I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin Fox
Twenty Three Pounds - and my will and desire is that all the rest of my
Estate be equally divided among my Children. I likewise make constitute
and appoint Benjamin Fox and William Robinson Executors to this my
last Will and Testament finally revoking all other Wills Legacies and
