

In the name of God, Amen. I Charles Heathcock of Greens-
ville County being weak and low in health but of sound mind &
Memory knowing it is once appointed for all men to die do make
and addin this my last Will and Testament revoking all other
Wills heretofore made by me and touching my worlly Estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with I apose
of the same in the following manner.

Item I lend to my wife Frances Heathcock during her
natural life or widowhood the Land whereon I now live with
four Negroes namely Selah, Wiley, Pol, and Jerry also one
more, also one Negro boy by ^{the} name of Dick until my son
Roland Heathcock arrives to the age of twenty one years Item,
I then give the said Negro Dick to my son Roland Heathcock
to him and his heirs and assigns forever, I also lend to my
wife Frances Heathcock one Negro boy name Allen until
my son Charles Heathcock arrives to the age of twenty one
years, Item, I then give the said Boy Allen to my son

to him and his heirs and assigns forever, I also lend to my
wife Frances Heathcock ^{Greensville County, Virginia Will Book 2, 1806 to 1816} ~~the~~ ^{the} said Negro boy name Allen until
my son Charles Heathcock arrives to the age of twenty one
years, then, I then give the said Boy Allen to my son
Charles Heathcock to him forever, and at the death of my
wife the Land whereon ~~we~~ ^{we} now live to be equally divided
between my two sons to wit Charles and Roland to them
and their heirs forever, and at the death of my ^{during her} wife or
widowhood the four Negroes namely Selah, Wiley, Pol, &
Jerry to be equally divided between my two sons Charles &
Roland Heathcock to them and their heirs and assigns
forever, but nevertheless in case either of my sons should die
without an heir lawfully begotten by his body the Negroes and
Land that I have given to him to go to the living child to him
and his heirs and assigns forever. Then, I give to each of
my Daughters to wit Mary, Pety, Julia, & Lucy Heathcock
one

on Feather Bed and furniture to them and their heirs forever.
I give to each of my sons Charles Heathcock and Rowland
Heathcock one feather bed and furniture to them and their heirs
forever but in case either should die leaving no heir lawfully begotten
by his body then the Bed then to go to the living child to him and his
heirs forever. Item my will and desire is for all the balance of
residue of my Estate not disposed of to be sold and the money to
be equally divided between my two sons to wit Charles Heath-
cock and Rowland to them and their heirs forever. I appoint
Daniel Robinson my Executor to this my last will and Testament
this the Twenty third Day of October 1806.
