Land held in conjunction by my Brother Richard Putney and myself
together with all my House hold and Kitchen Furniture Plantation
utensils, Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep &c and the Crop of Corn
Tobacco, Wheat, Tobacco, and Oats, except one Horse, two Beds & Furniture
one Chest of Drawers one Table and a half Dozen sitting Chairs.
My Will and desire is that the Money arising from such sale shall be
for the payment of my just Debts - and the remainder after the payment of
my Debts - my said residue shall be applied to the payment of a sum of Money
I shall hereafter give to my Son in Law, Henry C. Putney - and my desire
is that the sale of the above mentioned Property shall take place within
the Month of December or January next ensuing, and that my Negroes
& other said to wit for my Quarters shall remain with him the present year
until they finish their Crop. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my
said Son in Law, Henry C. Putney one Horse and Riding Chair, two Beds & Furniture

until they finish their crop. Secondly. I give and bequeath to my
beloved wife Mary C. Putney one Horse and Riding Chair, Two Beds & Furniture
the Chest of Drawers, one Table, a half dozen sitting chairs, and two Hundred
and fifty ~~some~~ ³⁰³ Cash to her and her heirs forever. Thirdly. My Will is
and desire is that all my Realities shall be equally divided between my loving
wife Mary C. Putney and my three children Eliza. In Pheny & Martha

William Maclean and John Goodwyn Executors of this my last Will and
