the mortality of my Body and knowing that is appointed for all Men
once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
that is to say principally and first ^{fully} I give and recommend my soul
to God that gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried in Decent
Christian burial nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
me in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner & form.
First it is my Will and desire that my son Thomas Maclean shall have
the liberty to take my Negro Man Fountain at Seventy Pounds which
sum is to equally divided between John Smith, Thomas Linder,
Benjamin Maclean and Susan Maclean. I give to my son James
Maclean my Negro Woman Sarah the fanning Mill & Kitchen furniture
the Plantation Utensils, one feather bed and furniture. I give to my
son Benjamin Maclean one negro boy named Cyrus and one feather
bed and furniture. I give to my Daughter Mary Smith my
curtain Bedstead Chests and Bedding Chair and Harps.

535/ I give to my Daughter Rebekah Haldane one Negro boy named Preston.
I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Haldane one Negro Girl named Charlotte
and new feathers to make ~~me~~ a Bed. I give to my Daughter
Susan one negro boy named Joe and one feather Bed & furniture.
It is my Will and desire that my Estate shall not be Appraised.
I constitute and ordain Thomas Maclen Executor to this my last
Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
Hand and seal this Eighth Day of December One Thousand
Eight hundred and Two. Elizabeth Maclen (L.S.)
