manner in sure and certain hope that I shall rise again in the general resurrection
at the last day and receive free pardon and remission of all my sins through the
merits and mediation of Jesus Christ my Saviour and as to what worldly
goods God hath graciously lent me I do give and bequeath in manner and
form following

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Amelia Pettway one feather
bed and furniture, one large chest, three pewter Dishes half dozen pewter plates

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son William Pettway one negro woman by
the name of Abby all the remainder of my Estate of what kind or quality soever
that I have not before mentioned and given away to him and his heirs forever.

Goods God hath graciously lent me I do give and bequeath in manner and form following

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Amelia Pettway one feather bed and furniture, one large chest, three pewter Dishes half dozen pewter plates

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son William Pettway one negro woman by the name of Alfey all the remainder of my Estate of what kind or quality soever that I have not before mentioned and given away to him and his heirs forever

Lastly, I do appoint my sons Edward and William Pettway to be my whole Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this seventh day of January one thousand, seven hundred and Ninety one

At Greenville County Court September 1795. This Will was proved according to law by the oaths of William Winfield, and William Holt witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of William Pettway one of the Executors therein named who made oath thereto according to law, and together with Joseph Wilkins and Richard Walker his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate was granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. Liberty being reserved for the other Executor to join in the said probat when he may think fit.
