Greenville and parish of Micherine being weak of body but of sound mind and
memory thanks to Almighty God for the same, calling to mind that it is appoint-
ed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament: that is to say, First of all I Give my Soul to Almighty God that
gave it me and my Body to my Mother Earth to be buried in a decent
Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing
doubting but at the General Resurrection to return the same by the mighty
power of Almighty God and as touching ^{such} worldly Goods as has been pleased
God to bestow on me I desire and bequeath as Follows. (To Wit.)

I lend to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Smith for and during her natural
life or widow hood the plantation whereon I now live containing ne Hundred
and Fifteen Acres and no more adjoining and beginning at the new chopped
line which I chopped for James Smith when one Negroe Girl by the name of
Fatty and one Leather Tack and furniture and it is my Will and desire at the

line which I chopt for James Smith also one Negroe Girl by the name of
Fathy and one Feather Bed and furniture and it is my will and desire at the
expiration of the above mentioned time, that the property which I have before
lent to my wife should be equally Divided between my two sons and the
child that my wife Elizabeth is now pregnant with, namely my two
sons Denny Smith and John Smith to them and their heirs and assigns
for ever.

Item, I give unto my son William Smith Five Acres
of Land whereon his house now stands also one Negroe Girl by the name
of Grace and her increase to him and his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item, I give unto my two sons James Smith and Joel Smith the upper
part and remainder of the tract of Land whereon I now live exclusive of the part
which I have before lent to my wife Elizabeth, to them and their heirs & assigns
for ever.

Item, I give unto my son James Smith one Negroe
Boy by the name of Jack to him and his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item, I give unto my son Nathaniel Smith the tract of Land that
I bought of Randle Vaughan containing Seventy Acres be the same more
or less.

And that my Wife Elizabeth is now pregnant with, namely my two
Sons Henry Smith and John Smith to them and their heirs and Assigns
for ever. ~~Item~~, I give unto my son William Smith Five Acres
