my Estate both real and personal during her natural life or
Widowhood. I Item, I give and bequeath to my son John
Cain after the Death or Marriage of ^{my} Wife my Land and
Plantation, one Negroe boy named Tom, also one Feather Bed
and Furniture to him and his heirs forever. I Item, I give
and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Cain one feather Bed and

of her Body in that case her part of said Estate to be equally
divided between the above mentioned Children. But if she
should have an heir or heirs my desire is that the said heir or
heirs at her death should have her part of said Estate equally
divided among them, to them, and their heirs forever. My Will
and desire is that after the death or marriage of my said Wife
that the Estate left her should be sold at publick Auction by
giving twelve Months Credit in Order that the division may be
made without confusion. Item, I desire no appraisment may
be made of my Estate, and lastly I do appoint my Wife Heziah Cair
Executrix, and my sons John Cair, and George Cair, Executors
