In the name of God Amen, I Hannah Grinstead of the County
of Greenville and State of Virginia being sick and weak of Body but of
perfect and sound mind and memory do make and declare this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Elenor Harris Twenty five Pounds of the money
I lodged in the Hands of James Parham to her and her heirs forever.
I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Rebekah Lundy the
Bond and Interest that is due me from Lewis Dupree to her and her heirs
forever. — The Bond due me from Sabez Morris and which is on demand
Christmas next ensuing. I give to my two Grand-sons James and Thomas
Lundy to be equally divided between them, also the balance of the Money
in the Hands of James Parham Viz. Nine Pounds Ten Shillings. I give to
my aforesaid Two Grand-sons James and Thomas Lundy to be equally
divided between them. — I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter
Rebekah Lundy my Fine Chest to her and her heirs forever.

Bond and Interest that is due me from Lewis Dupree to her and her heirs
forever. — The Bond due me from Sabej Morris and which is on Demand &
Christmas next ensuing, I give to my Two Grand-sons James and Thomas
Lundy to be equally divided between them, also the balance of the Money
in the Hands of James Tarham Virg. Nine Pounds Ten Shillings I give to
my aforesaid Two Grand-sons James and Thomas Lundy to be equally
divided between them. — I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter
Rebekah Lundy my Pine Chest to her and her heirs forever. —

The Two Bonds due me from William Lundy I desire to be divided
equally between my daughter Elenor Garriß and my Three Grand
Children Virg. James Lundy, Thomas Lundy, and Rebekah Lundy
to them and their heirs forever. My wearing apparel I give to my
Daughter Elenor Garriß and my Grand Daughter Rebekah Lundy
to be equally divided between them. — All my Cattle, Hogs, Horses
— hold and Kitchen Furniture of all kinds whatsoever by me now
possessed I desire may be sold and the money arising therefrom to be

(165) be equally divided between my Daughter Elenor Lundy and my three Grand
Children Viz James Lundy, Thomas Lundy, and Rebekah Lundy to them
and their heirs forever. — My Will and desire is that my Plantation
Utensils Viz Four killing Hoes and two weeding Hoes, one plow hoe, and
one axe be sold and the money divided as last mentioned. — I give to my
Daughter Elenor my Loom and Dutch oven. — The two Horse hides and
Two Hearting skins which is at Captain Braxton Robinsons on Tar
I desire to be sold and the money after deducting for the Tanning to be
equally divided between my Daughter Elenor, and my ^{three} aforesaid Grand
Children. — And I do hereby revoke and annul all other Wills by me
heretofore made, confirming and ratifying this and no other to be my
last Will and Testament. — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my Seal this second day of May in the Year of our Lord
One Thousand Eight Hundred and Two. I constitute and appoint my Grand
Son James Lundy to be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
