In the name of God..... I Henry Wyche of Greenville County do
dispose of worldly good the Lord hath blessed me with in the following
manner my will is that all gifts heretofore given by me to each of my
children stand as they are to each of them to their heirs and assigns
forever. I give to my Son Peter Wyche one Negro Tom which he hath
in possession to him his heirs and assigns forever. I give to my Son William
Wyche one Negro Glover which he hath in possession to him his heirs or
assigns. I give to my Daughter Rebecca Walton two Negroes Pardon
and Manser which she hath in possession to her and her heirs forever.
I give Negro Hannah and her increase (which I let my Daughter Sally
have when she married Gray Sills) at her death to be equally divided
between the four Children the said G. Sills dec^d had by Daughter Sally to
them & their heirs &c. I give to my Son George Wyche two Negroes Sam &
Ben which he hath in possession to him his heirs or assigns forever.

I give to my Son Henry Wyche the Land and plantation I now live on two
Negroes Jacob and Manny Johnson best wheels and Work Steers to him and
his heirs and assigns &c I give to grand Daughter Abial M Wyche one
Negro Dolly to her & her heirs or assigns &c I give to my Daughter Sally
Christian two Negroes Agga & Sydney Ford which she hath in possession
to her & her heirs or assigns &c the remainder of my Estate to be equally
divided between my Children to wit Peter, William, Rebecca & Sally
Christians four Children by Gray Sills dec^d George, Elley, & Henry that is
one seventh part ^{thereof} to be equally divided between the said fatherless
Children my will is that my Executors have a particular regard for the
Seven old black people and have them valued & not remove them out
out of the reach of their Husbands nor from my poor his wife ~~therefore~~
~~make~~ therefore make two, or three, or four (or as they may see best) Lots
that several of you my Children may bear the burden as they are
like to be a charge. I appoint my Sons William & Henry Wyche Executors
of this my Will and Testament invoking all others in witness whereof
I have hereunto set my Hand and seal this 20th Day of July 1803.
