good health, sound mind and memory ^{Greensville County Virginia Wills Book 2, 1806 to 1816} thank God therefor, but calling to mind the mortality
of body, doth give and dispose of my goods and chattels in manner and form as following,
Item, I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Haley one third part of all my Lands, my will
and desire is that her thirds of the plantation whereon I now live to be laid of in such a man-
ner as for her to have the privilege of half the dwelling house and kitchen during her natural
life - also I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Haley seven Negroes known by the names of
Harry, Button, Hollon, Mark, old Jimmy, Kiziah and Tommy during her natural life. I also
lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Haley my large Sorel mare and Colt, and five cows
and calves, five sows and pigs, forty barrels of corn, one bed and furniture one chest one wal-
nut table, two pots one pan, three earthen dishes one set earthen plates, one set knives and
forks and one pewter basin during her natural life - Item I give and bequeath unto my
son Harry Haley one third part of all the Lands that I now own and half of all my stock
of horses, cattle sheep, and hogs, household and kitchen furniture corn fodder and every
other article that I have not lent unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Haley to him and his
heirs forever. Also I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Haley, nine Negroes known
by the names of Isaac Isham Dick Ned, Joseph, Little Sarah, Little Jimmy, Rose and
Pat to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Hudson Haley
one third part of all my lands and my will and desire is that the division to be made for him

and Roger, to him and his heirs forever also half of my stock of cattle, horses, sheep, and hogs,
household and kitchen furniture corn and fodder and plantation utensils that I have not already
given away to wife Elizabeth Haley to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
unto my grandson Holliday Haley son of William Haley one negro boy by the name of Lewis
to him and his heirs forever, provided the said Holliday Haley ^{die} before he comes to law
ful age my will and desire is that the said negro should go to his brother James Haley.
Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Benjamin Harrison Prichard son of
Joshua Prichard one negro boy by name of Squire to him and his heirs forever, provided
the said Benjamin Harrison Prichard ^{die} before he comes to lawful age my will and
desire is that the said negro boy shall go to his brothers and sisters if any, if not the said
negro to descend back for the benefit of my two sons Henry Haley and Hudson Haley to them
and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son James Haley five shillings
Item I give and bequeath to my son Holliday Haley five shillings - Item I give and

and Roger, to him and his heirs forever also half of my stock of cattle, horses, sheep, and hogs,
household and kitchen furniture corn and fodder and plantation utensils that I have not already

unto my grandson Holliday Haley son of William Haley one Negro boy by the name of Lewis
to him and his heirs forever, provided the said Holliday Haley ^{die} before he comes to law-
ful age my will and desire is that the said Negro should go to his brother James Haley.
Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Benjamin Harrison Prichard son of
Joshua Prichard one Negro boy by name of Squire to him and his heirs forever, provided
the said Benjamin Harrison Prichard ^{die} before he comes to lawful age my will and
desire is that the said Negro boy shall go to his brothers and sisters if any, if not the said
Negro to descend back for the benefit of my two sons Henry Haley and Hudson Haley to them
and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath ^{unto} to my son James Haley five shillings.
Item I give and bequeath ^{unto} to my son Holliday Haley five shillings. Item I give and
bequeath ^{unto} to my Daughter Lucy Clark five shillings. Item I give and bequeath ^{unto} to my
Daughter Fady Fox five shillings. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Dolly Prichard five shillings. my will and desire is that the Land and Negroes

and increase of the said negroes that I have lent unto my wife and every other article that I have lent unto her to be equally divided between my two sons Henry Haley and Hudson Haley at the death of my wife to them and their heirs forever; the part of the houses that I have lent unto my wife my will and desire is shall belong unto my son Hudson Haley at her death: my will and desire is that if either of my sons Henry Haley and Hudson Haley should die without a lawful issue that the property that I have given him should go to the surviving one: my will and desire is that all my just debts should be paid out of the property that I have given to my sons Hudson Haley and Henry Haley to be mutually sustained by both and I do appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth, James Haley Henry Haley and Hudson Haley whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament disavowing and making void all other wills by me heretofore made: In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of February eighteen hundred and eight.
