proved according to Law by the Banns of Jeremiah Dupree and James Dupree
Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of the Executors
therein named who made Oath thereto and together with Lewis Dupree and Jeremiah
Dupree their Securities entered into and acknowledged their Oath in the Penalty
of two thousand Pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate was granted
to them for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.

and Parish of Saint Andrews, being weak in body but of sound Memory and
calling to mind the Mortality of the body, and knowing that it is appointed
for all Men Once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and
Testament, My Soul I give to God who first gave it me, and my body to the
Earth in sure and certain hope, that I shall rise at the last day and receive
a pardon and remission of all my sins, And as to my body, ^{my} desire ^{is that} it may
be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executor, what
worldly Goods it hath pleased God to lend me I give and bequeath as follows
In witness whereof My desire in the first place is that all my just debts be paid as
soon as may be. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Thomas
Lanier, One Sovel Ware called ^{Greenville 20 June 1780} Salt, ^{Wills 1780 1806} spoons, Dishes and six plates to him
and

(24) and his Heirs forever I Give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Benjamin Lanier, all the residue of my Estate of what kind or quality soever, to him and his Heirs forever. And lastly I constitute and appoint my Brother Benjamin Lanier whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fast my Seal this Nineteenth day of September in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight.
