of Greenville and Parish of Saint Andrews being sick and weak
but of a sound Mind and Memory thanks be to God, calling to mind
the certainty of Death I recommend my soul to Almighty God,
that gave it and as touching such Worldly Goods as it has been
pleased God to bestow upon me I have thought proper to give and
bequeath in the form and manner following. My Will and
Desire is that my just debts and Funeral expences be first paid
Whereas there is a claim made of a Negro Girl named Fancey
belonging to the Estate of Edward Powell Deceased by Littleton
Raines, It is my Will and desire that if the said Negroe Girl
Fancey is recovered of the ^{said} Estate by the said Raines or any person
or persons, Then it is my Will and desire that as much of my
Estate

41) Estate as the said Negroe Girl Fanny shall thought to be worth by two of the Court, shall be for my Daughter Tabitha Tuell Powell, when she shall arrive to the Age of twenty Years or Marriage, to her and her heirs forever, But provided the above mentioned Negroe Girl Fanny is not recovered as above mentioned, then my Will and desire is that the whole of my Estate of what kind or quality, whatsoever be sold, and the Money arising from such sale shall be divided in the following manner. It is my Will and desire that my Executors when they shall think proper, purchase a Horse, Saddle and Bridle out of my Estate for my Daughter Tabitha Tuell Powell for her and her heirs forever. It is my Will and desire that all the remainder of my Estate, be equally divided, between my Son William Hewitt Powell, and my Daughter Tabitha Tuell Powell, But provided my Children both die before they arrive to the Age of twenty one Years or Marriage, then it is my Will and desire that all my Estate of whatsoever kind be equally divided between the Children of my Brothers John Tuell and Hugh Tuell, and my Sisters, Elizabeth Brown, and John Brown, son of my Sister Lucy Brown to them and their heirs and assigns.
