bequeath in manner and form following after my just debts being paid.
I lend to my wife Elizabeth Maclean during her natural life the use of one
Negro named Charles one named Jack ^{woman} one named Joe one named Sarah
one named Rue one named Hannah and one named Jidy also all my
stock of all kinds except such as I shall hereafter Will away likewise my
household and kitchen furniture except such as I shall hereafter Will
away also I lend to my wife the Land and plantation I now live on
together with that tract of Land adjoining the round meadow all to her
during life.

I give, ratify, and confirm all former Gifts that my daughter Mary
Smith has now in possession to her and her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my son John Maclean the one half that tract

bequeath in ^{manes} and from following after my just debts being paid.

^{manes} I lend to my wife Elizabeth Maclean during her natural life the use of one Negro named Charles one named Jack ^{one} named Joe, one ^{woman} named Sarah one named Lue, one named Hannah, and one named Jiddy, also all my stock of all kinds except such as I shall hereafter Will away likewise my household and kitchen furniture except such as I shall hereafter Will away, also I lend to my wife the Land and plantation I now live on together with that tract of Land adjoining the round meadow all to her during life.

^{Item} I give and bequeath to my son John Maclean the one half that tract of Land in Warren that I bought of James Pranson, also the following Negroes, Andrew, Sall, Bob, and Frank, a small girl, three cows and calves, four Sows and Pigs, four ewes and Lambs, one bay fearnought mare, one feather bed and furniture, also the one half that tract of Land in Brunswick County to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Maclin the other half that tract of Land in Warren County, with the following Negroes, Ned, Lucy, Lewis and Betie three cows and calves, four sows and pigs, four ewes and Lambs, one sorrel horse, one feather ^{bed} and furniture, also the other half that tract of Land in Brunswick County to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebekah Maclin one negro woman named Phillis, one boy named Witer, one girl named Milly, also fifty pounds cash, one bay filley one year old, one feather bed, and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son James Maclin one tract of Land formerly John Denton deeded, with the following Negroes Ben, Rosie, Hall, and Eddy, one feather bed and furniture, three cows and calves, four ewes and Lambs, four sows and pigs, also the old fearnought mare, and stray black horse to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Maclin, one negro woman named Beck, one child named Mary, one woman named

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Maclin one negro named Rachel one boy named
forever.

Item I give unto my son Littleton Maclin one negro named Rachel one boy named
forever, one girl named Judy, and one girl named Cloe one feather bed and
furniture fourteen pounds cash, likewise after the death of my wife all the
Lands and Plantations as I have lent to my said wife to him and his
heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Maclin one negro woman
named Selia and her children Nannij, Ester, and Fanny, one feather bed
and furniture and twenty pounds cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Benjamin Maclin that tract of Land I bought off
John Willis in Warren County and that tract had of Drury Lanier in
Greenville County also a piece of Land that joins the said Land on the
South side the Three Creeks, a new survey, with the following negroes, Sam,
Peter, Liddie, and Jane, one feather bed and furniture also twenty
Pounds cash to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to all my aforementioned children all that Land left me
by

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by Colo John Maclin deced reference being had to the said Decedents Will
 over the mountains to be equally divided among them and their heirs forever. My
 desire is that if either my Children should die before they arrive to the age of
 twenty one years, and leave no Issue, that then my living Children shall
 share their Estate herein given except the Lands, and should either my sons
 die before they arrive to the age twenty one years, or marry and have Issue the
 Land given to such Child or Children be equally divided among my afore-
 said Sons then living to them and their heirs forever. Likewise after the
 death of my aforesaid wife all that Estate that lent to her except one negro woman
 named Sarah, and her increase, and one man named Joe, I give to her and her
 own disposing, and all the rest my Estate lent my said wife at her death be
 equally divided among my then living Children. And lastly, I do hereby
 appoint Frederick Maclin, Thomas Maclin, and William Maclin Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal this sixth day of June one thousand, seven hun-
 dred, and ninety one.

At Greenville County Court December 1794. This Will was
proved according to Law by the oaths of Benjamin Jones and William Goodrich
witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And none of the Executors therein named
appearing to qualify. On the motion of Thomas Maclin junr. who made oath
thereto according to Law, and together with Foster Cook and William ^{Wyche} Wilkins
his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of
ten thousand Pounds conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted
him for obtaining Letters of administration with the Will annexed in due
form according to Law.
