 my last will and Testament in manner and form following. First of all
 I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my

and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Martha Wenn Five pounds
Current Money of Virginia to be paid her out of my Estate before any division
takes place to her and her heirs forever. Item I give my right to Elizabeth
Wenn the sorrel Colt got by Bonners Horse to her and her heirs forever.
Item my will and desire is that my daughter Martha Wenn should have

Item I give my right to Elizabeth Wienn the sorrel Colt got by Bonners Horse to her and her heirs forever.

Item my will and desire is that my daughter Martha Wienn should have a Colt out of the same Mare or the same Breed out of my Estate before a division takes place. Item my will and desire is that the whole of my Estate be to

a bill out of the same. Thus or the value thereof out of my estate before a
division takes place. Item my will and desire is that the whole of my Estate here
fore not mentioned for to be sold and equally divided between my seven children
James Wrenn, Jones Wrenn, Henry Wrenn, Bates Wrenn, Elizabeth Wrenn, Mary
Woodford, and Martha Wrenn to them and their heirs forever. Item I nominate
and appoint my son Jones Wrenn, and my son Henry Wrenn Executors of this my
last will and Testament reckoning all other wills requests and legacies by me
heretofore made this only to be my last Will and Testament for them to execute
the same according to the form and effects of the above written will. In
Witness whereof I have hereto set my Hand and seal this Twenty First Day
of September in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand Seven Hundred
and Ninety Seven.
