In the name of God Amen I James Moore of the County of
Greenville being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks
be to Almighty God for the same and calling to mind the certainty of death
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last will and Testament in manner and form following First of all
I command my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my
body

body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner, hoping that at the general Resurrection of the dead to receive the same again by the mighty power of God through the merits of my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ, and as touching such worldly Estate as it has been the blessing of Almighty God to bestow on me I give bequeath and bestow in manner and form following, to my Item it is my will and desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth Henson sell and dispose of any part of my Estate as she thinks proper for the payments of all my just debts and general expences. Item I leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth Henson the whole of my Estate being of what kind or quality whatsoever during her natural life and then to be equally divided in manner and form following. Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Henson five pounds Current Money of Virginia to be paid her out of my Estate before any division takes place to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Martha Henson Five pounds Current Money of Virginia to be paid her out of my Estate before any division takes place to her and her heirs forever. Item I give my right to Elizabeth Henson the sorrel Colt got by Bonner's Horse to her and her heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that my daughter Martha Henson should have a Colt out of the same Horse and her right out of my Estate before any division takes place. Item my will and desire is that the whole of my Estate be to

Item I give to my daughter Martha Wenn five pounds Current Money of Virginia to be paid her out of my Estate before any division takes place to her and her heirs forever. Item I give my right to Elizabeth Wenn the sotral colt got by Bonner's Horse to her and her heirs forever.

Item my will and desire is that my daughter Martha Wenn should have a colt out of the same Mare. The mare to be sold of out of my Estate before a division takes place. Item my will and desire is that the whole of my Estate be left

a bolt out of the same. None or the value thereof out of my estate become a
division takes place. Item my will and desire is that the whole of my estate hitherto
foremost mentioned for to be sold and equally divided between my seven children
James Wren, Jones Wren, Henry Wren, Gates Wren, Elizabeth Wren, Mary,
Woodford, and Martha Wren to them and their heirs forever. Item I nominate
and appoint my son Jones Wren; and my son Henry Wren Executors of this my
last will and testament receiving all other wills requests and legacies by me
heretofore made this only to be my last will and testament for them to execute
the same according to the form and effects of the above written will. At
Witnesse whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-first Day
of September in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand eight hundred
and Ninety Five.
