lasting. as for my Body I commit it to the Earth to be buried at the
discretion of my Executors. First my Will is that my just Debts and
Funeral expences be paid. Secondly I leave my worldly Estate as follow-
eth. Viz. I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Rivers one
Negroe Boy named Willow, also one Feather Bed and furniture which
she has now in her possession to her and her heirs and assigns for ever
I Give I lend to my beloved Wife Anne Young my Plantation
and all my Lands during her Life, Widowhood and also all the
remainder part of my Estate during her life or Widowhood and
after her Decease to be equally divided among my children James
Young, Elizabeth Young, Sarah Young, Jemimah Young,

in and signified for ever

all my slaves to him his heirs and assigns forever

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remainder part of my Estate during her life or Widowhood and
after her Decease to be equally divided among my children, Ann
Young, Elizabeth Young, Sarah Young, Gemimah Young,
Mildred Young, William Young and Rebecca Young, My Will
and desire is that William ~~John~~ Henry Cook and John Fox should divide
the Estate when it comes to a division, And my desire is that my Estate
should not be appraised I do hereby constitute and appoint William
Fox Executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do acknowledge
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and ^{lived my} Seal this sixteenth day of
April 1701.

At a Court held for Greenville County the 24th day of January 1702.
This Will was proved according to Law by the Oath of Lucas
Tomlinson, a Witness thereto and ordered to be recorded. And the
Executor therein named refusing to take upon himself the burthen
of the execution thereof, On the Motion of William ^{Rives} who made Oath
thereto according to Law and together with Littleberry Robinson and
John Jeter his Securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond
in the Penalty of three thousand pounds Specie conditioned as
the Law directs certificate was granted him for obtaining Letters
of Administration on the Testators Estate with the Wile annexed in
due form. And at a Court held for the s^d County on the 25th day of
March 17014 This Will was proved by the Oath of Thomas A. Fox
a Witness thereto and Ordered to be Certified
