In the name of God Amen I John Chappell of Greensville
County being of sound mind and memory for which I thank God
and calling to mind the mortality of my Body do dispose of the
Worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with in manner and
form following To wit I will and desire that my Negro man Daniel
be free at my decease I lend to said Negro Daniel three acres of land
during his continuance thereon and bounded as follows beginning and
while oak before the front Door of my House thence to the East side

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of my Adhesion from Thine to a large dead Spanish Oak with few
privilege of Rail Timber ^{Greensville County, Virginia, Wills, Book 2, 1806 to 1816} ~~and of the~~ from off my other Land, I gave
to said David three Barrels of Rice and one hundred and fifty pounds
of pork. I give the rest of my Land to the poor of this County and also the
Loan of the above three acres after the decease & removal of said David
to the poor aforesaid. It is my Will that my Executor rent out the said
Land and the Money arising be paid to the Overseers of the Poor for the
use of the poor. It is my Will that the said Land never be sold but be
let out as before directed. I will that all my other Estate be sold and my
funeral Expenses be paid out of it. The balance of the Money therefrom
arising be paid to Stephen Chappell and Francis Roberts formerly
Francis Chappell if they come for it, if not for my Executor to do with it as
he may think best at his Death and lastly I appoint Henry Wyche
Executor of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other
Wills or Testaments heretofore made by me. In Witness whereof I have
